EPI Announces Speakers at Its 14th Annual Policy and Budget Conference, Set for Sept. 29

PROVIDENCE, RI: The Economic
Progress Institute (EPI) has announced
the speakers for its 14th Annual Policy
and Budget Conference, which is set
for Sept. 29 at the Crowne Plaza. Taking
the theme "We the People: The Rhode
Forward," the event calls on Rhode
Islanders to come together at a critical
moment in our state's and nation's
history to safeguard democracy and
advance equity. The program will
feature national thought leaders, local
champions for justice, and powerful
performances.

"At a time when democracy and equity are under threat, this conference is about Rhode Islanders coming together



to chart a better future," **said EPI Executive Director Weayonnoh Nelson- Davies**. "We're proud to convene leaders, advocates, and community voices who are determined to move the Rhode Forward."

The keynote speaker is **Davante Lewis**, who serves as Public Service Commissioner for Louisiana's 3rd District, representing over one million residents from Baton Rouge to New Orleans and across the River Parishes. Davante is the youngest person ever elected to the Public Service Commission in Louisiana, the first Black openly LGBTQ+ person elected to any office in the state, and the first LGBTQ+ individual to hold a statewide position in Louisiana's history. He was one of the plaintiffs in a landmark court case that successfully challenged Louisiana's racially gerrymandered congressional map, resulting in the creation of two majority-Black congressional districts. After his speech, Nelson-Davies will engage Davante in a Q-and-A session.

K. Joseph Shekarchi, Speaker of the RI House of Representatives, is one of two local leaders who will speak. Speaker Shekarchi will talk about the challenges of enacting state budgets aimed at addressing big problems at a time of shrinking federal support. A former longtime high school history and civics teacher, **Rhode Island Secretary of State Gregg Amore** will give a speech titled "Democracy Led by the People for the People."

EPI Director of Research and Fiscal Policy Alan Krinsky and **EPI Policy Director Nina Harrison** will present research and data in a presentation called "We the People: The Rhode Forward to Tax Justice." RI youths **Eugenie Rose Belony** and **Max Beattie** will lead a special "We See You" ceremony recognizing everyday Rhode Islanders who are strengthening our democracy and mapping a more equitable future.

The Raging Grannies of RI will open the event with a singing performance and renowned gospel singer **Nyisha Conry Siliya** will give a closing performance.

Resource tables from community partners — including the ACLU of RI, Common Cause RI, the Freedom to Read Coalition, and the Secretary of State's Office — also will be available.
